



Show students the cover page of the Teacher Book. Ask them to tell you what they see on that picture. Allow them to talk about the scars on Jesus' hands.

DISCUSSION (5-10 minutes)

- Where were the disciples gathered together and why were they afraid? (The disciples were gathered together in the same place where they had celebrated the Passover meal with Jesus, just a few days before. They were scared that the people who had crucified Jesus would try to kill them, too.)
- Who showed up in the room where the disciples were? What did they think it was? (Jesus appeared in the room, but they thought it was a ghost,) ر.
- go into all the world and share the good news with everyone. Extend ask What was the good news Jesus wanted the disciples to share the good news that He had died to pay the price for sin. He rose again, defeated death, and offers eternal life to anyone who believes in Jesus gave the disciples a new command, called the Great Commission. What was it? (They were told to Б.
- What happened to Jesus while He was blessing the disciples? (Jesus was carried up to heaven.)
- What did the disciples do and how did they feel after Jesus went back into heaven? (They worshipped him and were excited to share the good news of Jesus with the world.) ഗ.

Extend the discussion— Teachers, these questions may be harder concepts to grasp. Take time to go over this and answer questions your students may have.

- Adam and Eve. Sin means we became separated from God, because He is holy and can't be around sin. The punishment for sin is death, God loves us and made a plan to rescue us, so that we could be free from death. He sent Jesus to take that punishment for us and to be our sacrifice. Jesus died in our place. He took death upon himself and separated himself from His father, so that we don't have to be separated Why did Jesus have to die for our sins? (Sin entered the world way back in the garden of Eden with
- What does it mean when we say Jesus defeated death? (Jesus died on the cross, but He didn't stay dead. When He rose again, He defeated death. That meant that death could not keep him in the grave.)
- Why is it important that Jesus rose again on the third day? (It was important that Jesus would rise again on the third day because the Bible pointed to a Savior who would take our punishment for sin, but that He would also rise again from the dead. If He had stayed dead, there would be no hope. He would just be another man who died. But, since He rose again from the dead, that meant He was truly Б.
- What is eternal life and how can we earn it? (Eternal life is life that never ends. It is a gift that Jesus offers to those who believe in him. There is nothing we could ever do to earn eternal life. But, Jesus will give it to us if ask him. Here's how (have your Bibles marked to these verse. Use the paraphrase below, if needed) -
 - A ADMIT to God that you are a sinner and ask him to forgive you from your sins. (Romans 3:23 All have sinned; Romans 6:23 The price of sin is death. But God gives the gift of eternal life through Jesus.)
- John 3:16 God loves us so much that He sent His only son, Jesus. Whoever believes in him will live - BELIEVE that Jesus is the Son of God who died take your punishment for sin.
 - C —CHOOSE to live your life for Jesus obey His commands and love him with all your heart. (Mark 12:30 Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength.)




