



# Mini Lesson Flan

# PALM SUNDAY

### OBJECTIVE

Students will learn the story of Palm Sunday, Jesus' last entry into Jerusalem, from the Gospel accounts in Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19, and John 12, and be able to answer discussion questions from the lesson.

## MATERALS

- Bible
- Printed Teacher Book
- Printed copies of the mini book for students (prepare these ahead of time by cutting the page into 4 pages and stapling the book together)
- Crayons/Pencils

# TEACHING TIME (5 minutes)

Ask students to join you as you open your Bible to the New Testament. Explain to students that the story you are going to share with them comes right from God's Word.

Show students the cover page of the Teacher Book. Ask them to tell you what they see on that picture. Tell the students to listen as you read the story. Explain to your students that the lesson of Palm Sunday was beginning of what many refer to as Holy Week, the week between Palm Sunday and Easter.

Read the pages and show students the pictures as you go. If your students are able to dig a little deeper, follow up with details of what the Passover signified (Exodus 12) was and why Jesus was going to celebrate it. You can also take a few moments to explain the significance of Jesus riding on a donkey into Jerusalem, as a king, and how it fulfilled a prophecy written 500 years before hand (Zechariah 9:9), that pointed to the fact that Jesus was the Messiah the people were waiting for.

# ACTIVITY (5 minutes)

Send students to their seats and distribute copies of their mini book. Direct students to write their name and color the pictures. When students are finished, move on to the discussion questions.


# DISCUSSION (5 minutes)

- Where was Jesus traveling to and why? (Jesus was traveling to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover.)
- Why did Jesus send two of his disciples ahead of him into the city? (Jesus wanted them to go get a donkey for him to ride on.)
- Why did the crowd of people want to see Jesus? (Many people had heard about the miracles Jesus was doing in God's name and they wanted to see him.) ₽,
- Why did the people put palm branches on the road for Jesus? (This was how they greeted kings. They were celebrating Jesus' arrival and worshipping him.) 4.
- What did the crowd say as Jesus came into Jerusalem? (The people praised God and said, "Hosannal Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!") Take a moment to explain to your students what this means The word "Hosanna" means "save us" The people saw the amazing things Jesus was doing and they wanted to worship him and for Jesus to save them. ഗ.
- Why did the evil men want to get rid of Jesus? (The evil men were angry that Jesus was being treated like a king and that people were following and worshipping him.) છ


