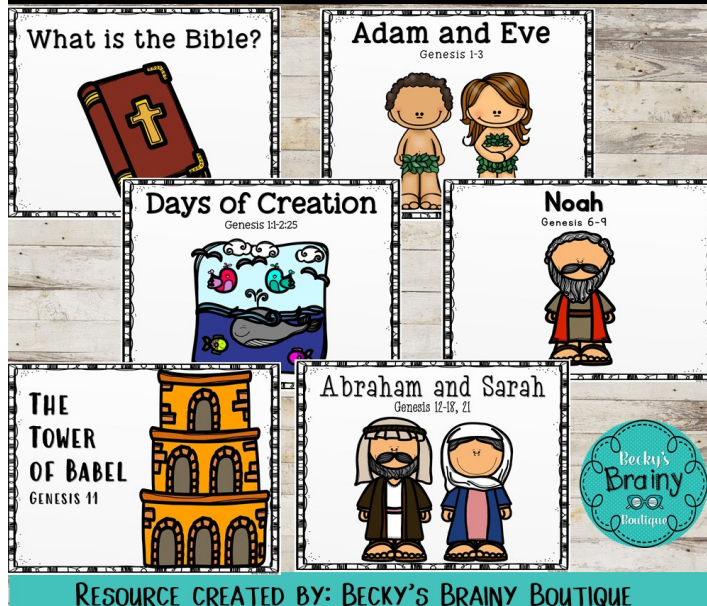

# Mini Lesson Plan

## THE TEN PLAGUES



### OBJECTIVE

Students will learn the story of The Ten Plagues, from the Bible, Exodus 7-12, and be able to answer discussion questions from the lesson.

### MATERIALS

- Bible
- Printed Teacher Book
- Printed copies of the mini book for students (prepare these ahead of time by cutting the page into 4 pages and stapling the book together)
- Crayons/Pencils

### TEACHING TIME (5 minutes)

Ask students to join you as you open your Bible to Exodus 7-12. Explain to students that the story you are going to share with them comes right from God's Word.

Show students the cover page of the Teacher Book. Ask them to tell you what they see on that picture and engage in discussion. Tell the students to listen as you read the story.

Read the pages and show students the pictures as you go.

### ACTIVITY (5 minutes)

Send students to their seats and distribute copies of their mini book. Direct students to write their name and color the pictures. When students are finished, move on to the discussion questions.

### DISCUSSION (5 minutes)

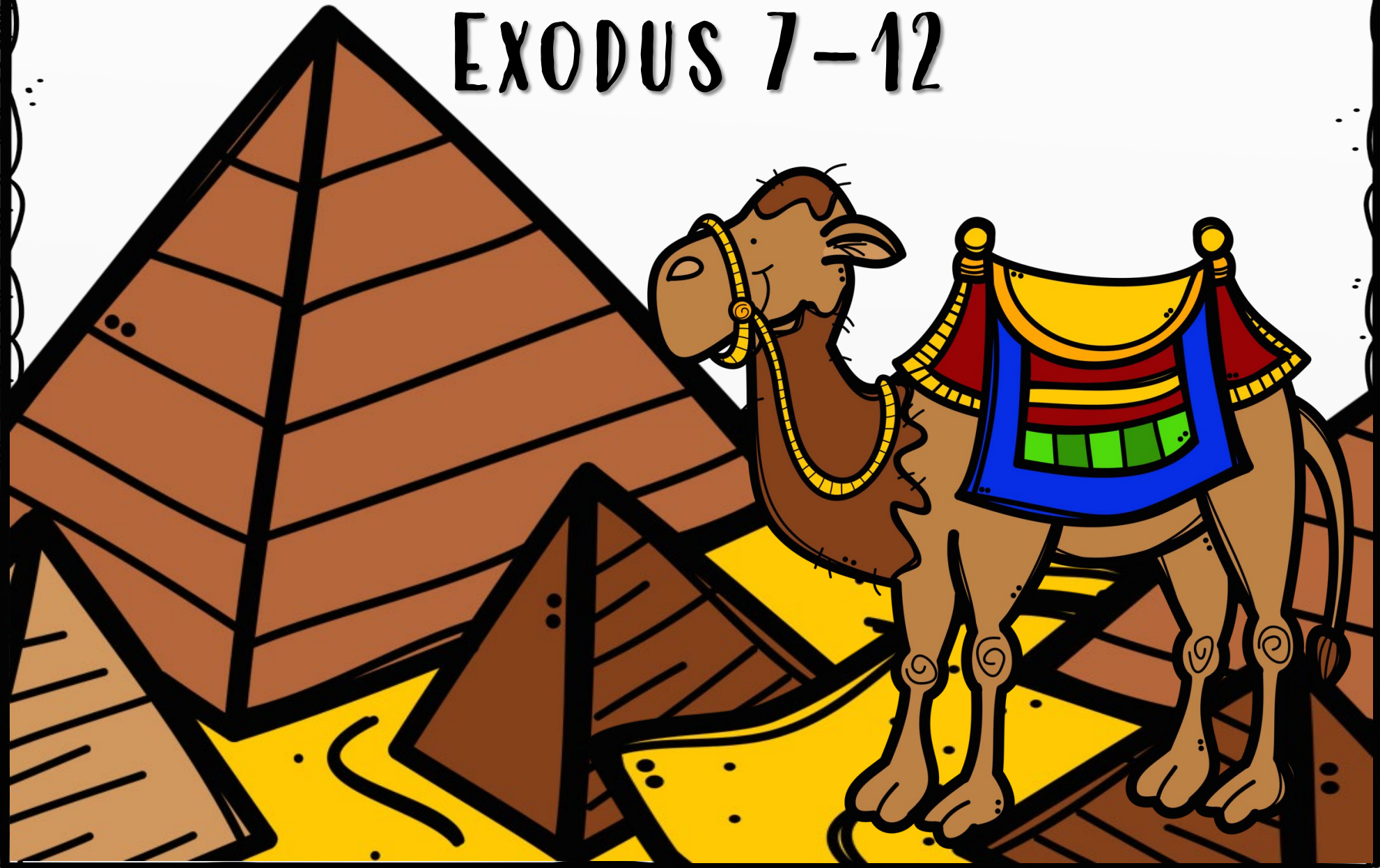
1. Who was keeping God's people as slaves in Egypt? (Pharaoh)
2. Who did God send to tell Pharaoh to let his people go? (God sent Moses.)
3. What was the first punishment or plague that God sent to Egypt? (God turned the Nile River into blood.)
4. What was the 2<sup>nd</sup> plague? (Frogs were everywhere)
5. What was the 3<sup>rd</sup> plague? (Itchy lice)
6. What was the 4<sup>th</sup> plague? (Biting flies)
7. What was the 5<sup>th</sup> plague? (Egypt's animals got very sick and died.)
8. What was the 6<sup>th</sup> plague? (The Egyptians were covered in painful boils)
9. What was the 7<sup>th</sup> plague? (God sent a huge, scary hail storm.)
10. What was the 8<sup>th</sup> plague? (God sent locusts to eat all the crops.)
11. What was the 9<sup>th</sup> plague? (Darkness that lasted 3 days)
12. When Pharaoh still refused, God sent the 10<sup>th</sup> plague. What was it? (All the firstborn children of Egypt died.)
13. What happened after the 10<sup>th</sup> plague? (Pharaoh told Moses to take the Israelites and all their belongings and leave Egypt. Over 2 million people left Egypt because God saved them)
