

Priscilla



Read Acts 18:1-3.
Where were Priscilla and her husband living? (verse 1)
Where did they live before that?
What was their job? (verse 3)
These verses to do not mention that Priscilla had any children. She worked alongside her husband in their business. They worked as a team.
Who stayed with them? (verses 1 & 3)
What do you already now about him?
Plan a project and put together a team of friends or family members to accomplish it. You might bake something together for an elderly church member or clean out the attic together.
Was it easier to complete the project with a team of people to help?
We can work as a team to accomplish something effectively.

Have you ever heard of a Home Church? In other countries where there is no church or where they must meet in secret, people often meet in homes. Some of the first churches after Jesus' time here on earth, were started in homes.

Read Acts 18:18-21.
Where did Priscilla, her husband and Paul go together?
(verse 18)
Where were they when they parted ways
(verse 19)
The city where they stayed was the most important city in Asia Minor. They stayed to get their business going there. Do you remember what they made and sold?
Read 1 Corinthians 16:19.
What did Priscilla and her husband start in their home?
A They worked as a team to host the first church gatherings.

Ask your mom if maybe you could host a Bible Study in your home one night. You could serve a snack and use one of the Bible Studies from this Growing Character journal. One suggestion might be Lydia and serve purple-themed snacks and have everyone wear purple.

Write the reference 1 Cor. 15:58 on one side of an index card. Write the verse on the other side. Stick the card in your pocket or backpack and take it wherever you go. When you're waiting for class to start, in the car, or just sitting around, pull out the card and test your memory.

Read Acts 18:26-28.
What was the name of the Jew who spoke boldly in the
synagogue?
List two things verse 24 says about him.
He was a follower of John the Baptist. He knew the Old Testament laws very well. But, he didn't understand that Jesus was the Messiah. What happened when Priscilla and her husband explained it to him? Did he believe? (verse 28) Priscilla and her husband worked together as a team in sharing the gospel message.
What did he do after that?
Have you ever thought about how witnessing to one person could affect a whole lot more people? That one person could tell someone, who goes and tells someone else, and so on.
Write the name of someone you might tell about Jesus.
We can work as a team in sharing the gospel.

Read Romans 16:3-5.
The verses you just read are part of a letter written by Paul to the church in Rome.
What did Paul say Priscilla and her husband did for him?

This probably happened in Corinth or Ephesus, but no further details are given.

Write a story about what you think could have happened.

Of course, we don't know for sure what really happened, but we can know that Priscilla and her husband were good friends to Paul. They worked as a team in taking care of their friends.

In what ways are you a good friend? In what ways can you be a better friend?

We can work as a team in taking care of our friends.

How can you be a better team player?

Remember, God has given us power for life. He will help you to be diligent. Diligence is not perfectionism. Instead, it's trying and doing your best.

Teamwork is very important so we can accomplish many things for Christ.

Gospel Message

Have you ever wondered why Jesus had to die on the cross?

When God created the very first people, He made a garden for them to live in. He would visit them there and actually walk with them. (Genesis 3:8)

Later, God instructed Moses to build a tabernacle so He could come dwell there. God wanted to be with people.

He wanted to spend time with people here on earth, but He didn't want it to stop here.

God loves us and He wants us to live with Him in Heaven forever when we die.

God gave people some rules so we could know the right things to do. Those rules are known as the Ten Commandments. When we break one of these rules or commandments, we sin. The consequence or price we must pay for sinning is death and separation from God. (Romans 6:23) That means when we die, we won't be able to live in Heaven with Him. Heaven is a perfect place and sin cannot be there. Instead, the place we will be sent is a place called Hell and it is a terrible place.

The Bible says that all people sin. (Romans 3:23) That means we all deserve the consequences for our sin - death and separation from God.


But, remember, God loves you so much. He wants you to live in Heaven with Him forever.

Way back when the very first people sinned, God made a plan to save them from their sin. His plan was to one day send His one and only Son, Jesus, to face the consequence or pay the price for our sin. Remember, the consequence is death. (John 3:16)

Jesus' death on the cross paid the price for our sin. Three days later, He arose. There was no reason for Him to stay dead. He had paid in full. It was finished!

If you believe this and are moved to accept this special thing that Jesus did for you, you need talk to Him and tell Him. Your prayer could sound something like this, "Dear God, I realize that I have sinned and I am sorry. I know that Your Son, Jesus, died to pay the price for my sins. I trust in Him now as my Lord and Savior."

Tell your parents that you prayed this prayer. They will be so happy!

T-hank (Tell God thank you for all the good things that He has done to/for you. Did you eat today? Did you have clothes to wear? There are lots of things to be thankful for.

S-upplication (Ask God for what you need/want. As you make your list, think about if what you're writing is something that He'd want too.)
