PROGRAMS' GUIDE

<u>Sunday School</u> is a prelude to the regular Sunday Worship and it holds in the Hall of worship between __ and __ thereafter, the Sunday Worship follows. And all Workers are expected to meet for intercessory prayers & program planning an hour every Sunday morning before Sunday school commences and for all other programs of the Assembly.

<u>Mid-week activities</u> - (1) Bible Study on every ___ by ___ (2) "The Revival Hour" (i.e. Prayer Meetings) on every ___ by ___. Days and times of these programs can be fixed according to the choices of individual Assembly. Also, the time of meetings may be adjusted according to the season of the year (i.e. winter and summer). These meetings could be held in the Church buildings and/or in the form of Home Bible Study and Home Fellowship in different zones of members' habitants.

<u>Faith Clinic & Holy Communion</u> – These come up every first Sunday of the month. This of course will involve fasting and praying in all the Assemblies.

<u>Testimony & Thanksgiving</u> - These come up every last Sunday of the month. Members should be encouraged to share their testimonies and brings offering to the Lord.

<u>Power Night</u> - This should be organised by each Assembly at least once in a chosen night of every month. It is important that all the Assembly's workers and leaders be present in the Power Nights.

<u>Corporate programmes</u> - Assemblies may participate in one another programmes according to the provision of this By-law. Special programmes and events such as Anniversaries, Launching, Revivals or Crusades, Love Feast, Musical Extravaganza, Retreats, Picnics, Living Springs etc., as would be organised jointly or by individual Assembly must be authorized by the National Administrative Board (NAB).

<u>Christian Ordinances</u> – We have mentioned some of these above. The Ministry recognises and accepts only what the Bible teaches on Christian Ordinances (e.g. Holy Communion, Water Baptism, Tithes and Offerings etc). We again recommend that all our members and Church workers in particular, should observe regulations on this issue as contained in the Ministry's By-Laws.

<u>Leadership Development Programs (LDP)</u> - Members of the National Administrative Board & Presbytery Board of all Assemblies are expected to follow the Ministry's Leadership Training Programmes whenever they are requested to do so.

<u>Child Dedication</u> - Before a child can be dedicated in the Church, both the Father and Mother must give their consent to the dedication (In writing). This becomes necessary in situation whereby one of them is not a permanent and regular member of the church. However, Children born outside wedlock can be dedicated. We believe that the Church must take up responsibility towards the future and destiny of mankind either old or young no matter what the case may be.
